Bunting!



BUNTING!

Some people think bunting is cheesy but I love it. It's cute, fun, easy to make, and customizable to every occasion. Celebrating a birthday? Bunting! Gathering to welcome a new baby? Bunting! Marching in the streets? Make a bunting sign!



Tools: I used a glue gun, pencil, ruler, exacto knife, paper, string and a cutting mat. The ingredients are: something to hang from, something to cut with and something to hang.

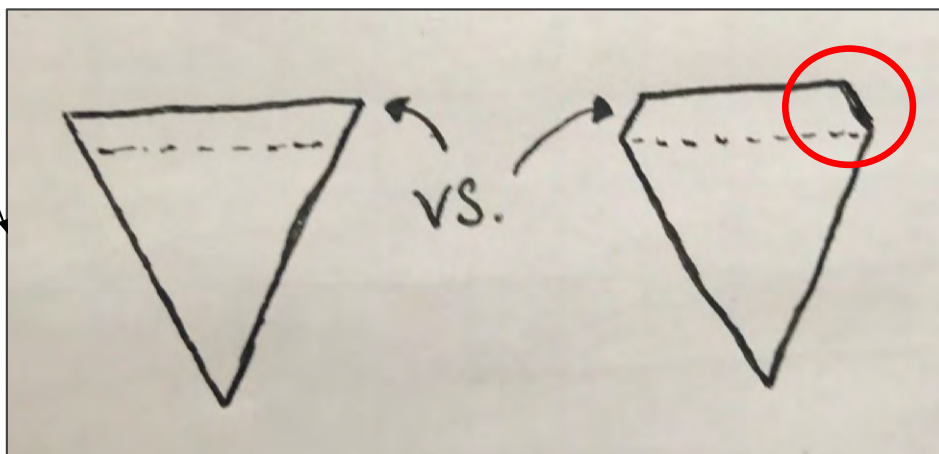
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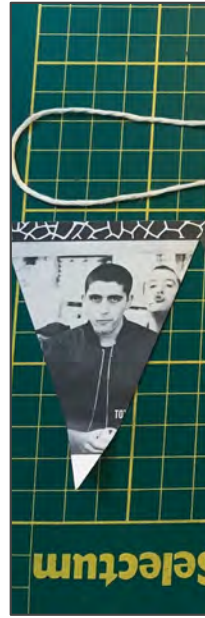
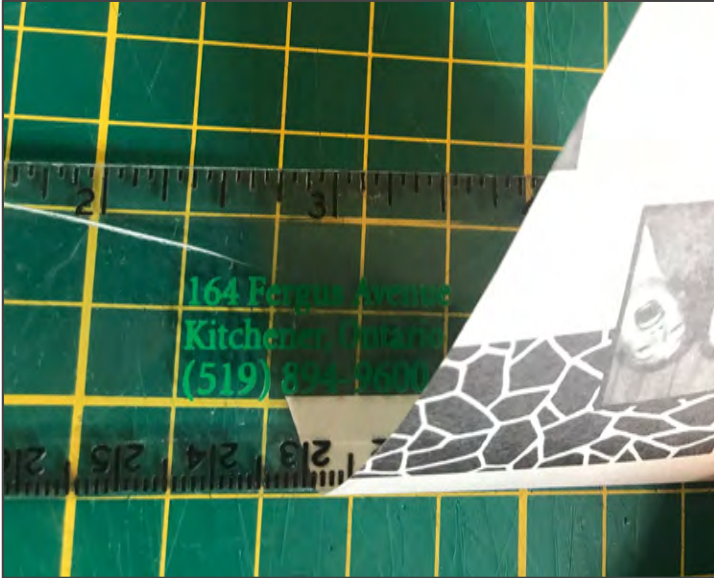
Step One: Design your bunting. It can be classic triangles, animal silhouettes, leaves from the forest floor, really anything!

Step Two: Measure your pieces and cut them out. I used an exacto knife and a ruler. You could also use scissors or just your hands.

Tip: Cutting the top two corners of your triangle will save you time later. The corners won't poke out and won't need gluing.



Step Three: Organize your pieces and cut a length of string with a couple extra inches on either end [this is to tie loops later].



Step Four: of each pie the string.

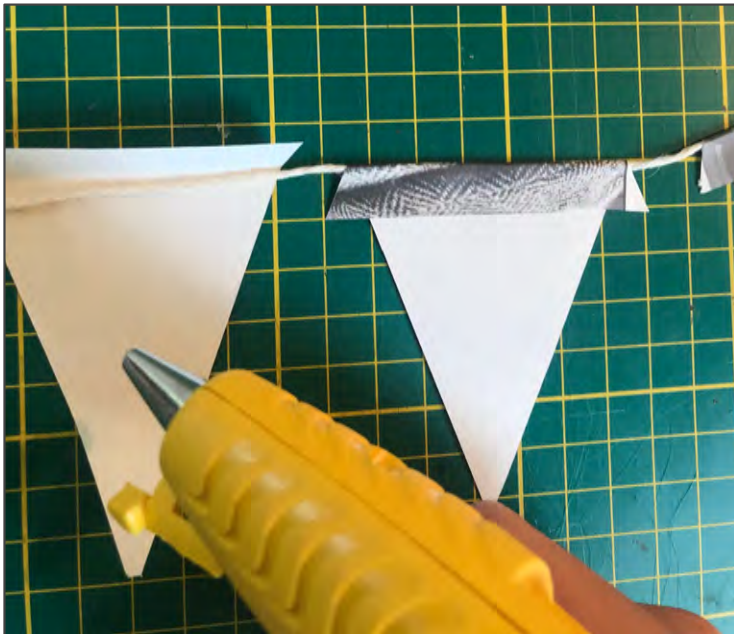
Step Five: Place your pieces face-down and roughly put the string in each of the folds. Then put glue into the fold and press the paper over the string and glue. You can also secure everything with a glue stick, staples or thread.



Step Six: Tie loops at the end of your string & trim.



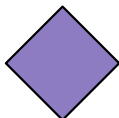
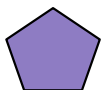
Use a ruler or other hard surface to fold over the top edge. This is to get it ready to be glued and folded over



Step Seven: Hang your work in a window, on your wall, from two poles to carry around!



I hope this is a nice craft to do alone or with pals and that it brings a little brightness to your spaces <3
