"Suitable Climate" by Donovan Hayden delves into the forgotten history of Black settlers in Western Canada. From 1905 to 1912, over a thousand Black Americans migrated and established resilient communities around Edmonton, Alberta, despite facing systemic anti-Black racism. This historical fiction follows the Cook family, who navigated these challenges to build a home. Their story is intertwined with a contemporary narrative of a father and son rediscovering this hidden past. Both families confront the struggles of claiming space, resisting racism, and finding joy in their lives. By shedding light on this neglected chapter of Canadian history, "Suitable Climate" challenges the narrative that Black people are foreign and do not belong in Canada. The play underscores the enduring impact of Black settler communities on our present-day understanding of Black Canadian identity.
